Step 1:

Register for RNIB Bookshare

RNIB Bookshare Education Collection is a free service for schools in the UK. It provides access to over 1 million education titles in various accessible formats.

The collection covers the entire education landscape, from early years to higher education.

You can register any student in your school who is:

- Neurodivergent: dyslexic, autistic, ADHD
- Vision impaired: blind, partially sighted
- **Physical disability:** where the use of print resources is significantly impacted

Step 2:

Subscribe to EasyReader Premium

Deliver reasonable adjustments for your students who are neurodivergent or vision impaired. An EasyReader Premium Education Plan ensures your students can read curriculum resources independently in a way that is accessible for them. An Education Plan provides:

Step 3:

Download EasyReader App

Ensure your students have EasyReader App installed on the devices they use to read at school and at home. The app is free to download for Apple iPads, iPhones and Macs, Android smartphones and tablets and Windows devices.

Students can sign in to the app to benefit from Premium features. This enables them to:

- Continue reading at school and home the book list, positions, bookmarks and settings are saved across devices.
- Import classroom files and clipboard texts.
- Choose from a range of premium reading voices.
- Sign in to EasyReader App on a Mac.



Step 4:

Share curriculum resources with students

Students can read a range of digital resources including Word files, text-based PDFs, ePub files and text copied from web pages.

Here are some of the ways teachers can share curriculum resources with students:

- RNIB Bookshare. Use the RNIB Bookshare website to create reading lists. Students can open their reading lists and browse the entire RNIB Bookshare collection within EasyReader App.
- Google Classroom or Microsoft Education. Students added to your Education Plan can download classroom resources shared on Google Classroom or Microsoft Education.
- Sharing resources electronically. Students can open resources shared via email or the school Virtual Learning Environment. With EasyReader Premium, students are able to import and read as many files as they like.

Step 5:

Tailor your accommodations

Gain valuable insights into the reading engagement of your students. An Education Plan enables teachers to view:

- When EasyReader App was last used
- All the titles that have been read
- The current reading position for each title
- The amount of time spent reading each title

As well as demonstrating the positive impact of accessible reading, these insights can also enable your team to open a conversation with students who are less engaged with their reading. This can help to identify additional accommodations needed for your students to succeed.
